Key Facts

People in the Stone Age had to make clothes from animal skins, make tools for hunting and carpentry, find water and shelter and build and maintain fires for heat and cooking.

Skara Brae - a perfectly preserved Stone Age village in Scotland - shows us how our ancestors lived during the Stone Age and how this is different to the way we live.

In the Stone Age, they used cave paintings to tell stories. The majority were of animals or hunters and were painted onto the cave walls using natural colours from mineral pigments. They used stencils to help them.

The most famous cave paintings can be found in Lascaux Cave, Magura Cave and Chauvet Cave.
