Emmeline Pankhurst

Emmeline Pankhurst was a British political activist known for leading the Suffragettes and winning women the vote.



Key facts

Emmeline was born on 15th July 1858.

She married a lawyer named Richard who helped her with her cause.

She founded the Women's Social and Political Union in 1903.

Her famous saying was 'Deeds not words' which encouraged women to take action to get the vote.

Democracy

A system of government by the whole population eligible to vote

Vote

A group of people decide fairly by all expressing their opinion

Suffragette

A member of an activist women's organisation in the early 20th Century

Equality

Where everyone is treated the same

Suffrage

The right to vote in political elections
