PE and Sport Premium Funding 2024–2025

Overview

The PE and Sport Premium is government funding provided to primary schools to improve the quality of physical education, physical activity and sport. Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the PE, sport and physical activity they provide.

At Lainesmead Primary School and Nursery, we aim to ensure that all pupils develop the skills, confidence and motivation to lead healthy, active lifestyles and to participate in a wide range of sports and physical activities.

Funding Summary

Total PE and Sport Premium funding received for the academic year 2024–2025:

£19,110

Total expenditure:

£18,280.24

How the Funding Has Been Spent

Equipment and Resources – £14,640

Funding was used to purchase a range of sports equipment and resources to support the delivery of high-quality PE lessons and physical activity across the school.

Impact:

- Increased opportunities for pupils to participate in a wider range of sports and activities.
- Improved access to appropriate equipment for both lessons and active playtimes.
- Enhanced quality of PE teaching and learning.

Internal Sports Competitions – £1,192

Funding supported the organisation of internal competitions and sporting opportunities within the school.

Impact:

- Increased participation in competitive sport.
- Encouraged teamwork, resilience and sportsmanship.
- Raised the profile of PE and sport across the school.

Staff Professional Development (CPD) – £2,345

Funding supported staff development through coaching support, training and online resources.

Breakdown:

- External coaches supporting staff confidence and skill development: **£1,500**
- Online training and resource development: **£695**
- External training courses: **£150**

Impact:

- Increased staff confidence and competence in delivering PE lessons.
- Improved quality of teaching in PE and school sport.
- Greater staff knowledge of effective PE teaching strategies.

Inter-School Sports Competitions – £103.24

Funding supported participation in competitions with other schools.

Impact:

- Increased opportunities for pupils to participate in competitive sport.
- Broader experience of sporting events and teamwork.

Impact of the PE and Sport Premium

The use of this funding has had a positive impact across the school:

- Increased staff confidence, knowledge and skills in teaching PE.
- Increased engagement of pupils in regular physical activity and sport.
- Raised the profile of PE and sport as part of whole-school improvement.
- Broader and more equal experiences of a range of sports and physical activities.
- Increased participation in school sport and competitions.
- Improved pupil attainment in PE.

Sustainability

The school aims to ensure that improvements are sustainable by:

- Developing staff confidence and expertise through training and coaching support.
- Purchasing quality equipment that can be used in future years.
- Embedding high-quality PE teaching practices within the curriculum.
- Continuing to promote participation in sport and physical activity across the school.

Swimming and Water Safety (Year 6)
